





Okay, so it's March and time for the AKC delegates to gather together. It was not the most thrilling meeting I have ever attended.

March is when the AKC has its annual meeting and selects those members who will become the class of 2028. This year Dr. Carmen Battaglia, Susan Fineburg and Dr. Michael Knight were elected. The only one new to the board is Susan Fineburg.. Dr. Thomas Davies was again selected as Chairman and Dominic P. Carota his vice-chair.

This times committee meetings were shorten so delegates could make a safari to the Museum of the Dog. If you are ever in New York, please do visit it. It is a charming place which I love. I didn't go this year, but I've been there so didn't feel the need to return this time. Since the committee meetings were shortened there is nothing to report from them.

Soooooo.....on to the general assembly. Proposals to be voted upon:

Article XII, Section 1 – deals with making complaints to the AKC. It makes the process of administering oaths easier, and clarifies what happens to the monies required to make such complaints. Simply put - if the Board upholds the complaint the deposit will be returned, if it isn't the AKC keeps it.

Chapter 12, Section 1 and 4 – deals with show catalogs. It deletes the requirement to print the addresses of the judges and exhibitors replacing it with just the city and state and if provided e-mail addresses.

Then there was a whole bunch of changes dealing with Beagle field trials, since most of us don't have those little darlings, if you want to know contact me and I'll be happy to enlighten you.

Read at this meeting to be voted on in June were two articles. First Article VII, Section 1 which would remove the two consecutive term limit for AKC board members. I remember when this rule was first proposed and passed. It has its good points and bad points, so now we are going back to the old way. If you have any thoughts about this and wish to share them with me, please contact me.



Manchesters in Agility

GM King with Beth Mathews-Bradshaw and Inez Pennington Part 2 of 2 Inez Pennington

GMK: When did you first get involved with agility and what led you to the sport?

IP: It's been over a dozen years ago, but our rescue mutt zoomed round and round our back yard like a race car, so we named him Andretti. We needed some structure, so I finally landed on a beginning agility class. I had no idea there was a jumping sport for dogs! Since I grew up jumping in Hunter/Jumper competitions and showed at the National Horse Show in Madison Square Garden, agility was a natural fit and has been a perfect match.

GMK: How do you and Kipsey train? Have your training approaches and methods changed over time?

IP: Since Kipsey wasn't my first agility dog, I had my handling system chosen and it had trained me, so we have not had any drastic changes since he first started.

GMK: How do you define success in agility? Does your definition differ from others and if you think so, how?

IP: For me, agility is a brain game. Some people do wordles and other puzzles, but I think it's a gas to figure out the best way to train (or re-train) a particular thing (I'm really good at thinking of things from the dog's point of view), and also the best strategy/alternative options to have success on the course.

Another part of my game is that I use Susan Garrett's H360 handling system, so I pretty much have a verbal for everything. She calls it "verbal override". In other words, do what I say and not what I do.

Which breaks rule #1 in agility handling! Namely, that the handler's motion is the most basic and important cue for the dog, followed by his/her position and gestures, with verbals bringing up the rear in effectiveness.

What it means for us as a team is that Kipsey has quite a vocabulary on and off the field, and he listens! If I say the wrong directional cue, he will do it no matter where I am. So I have to practice saying left and right when I'm walking the course, otherwise, if I give him the wrong direction, that's where he goes.

Lately we have upped our game. Instead of running four or five classes a day chasing titles, we've increased our challenge to the International level in AKC & other venues.

Will I ever be happy enough with where we are to just sit in the rocking chair? Probably not. Because I'm a problem solver, so increasing challenges keeps me busy figuring out how to train and I get a kick out of getting results It's very validating and satisfying.

GMK: If you were recruiting newbies to the sport, how would you sell them on agility? What would you tell them to expect? What reasonable goals might they set?

IP: I was once a liaison to the public at a trial in Southern Missouri Many people were just dying to get started. I told them that ithe best way you to get started train your dog to walk around the neighborhood with you and not look at anything else. Squirrels, other dogs, whatever. That's the best prep you could possibly have before trying to run agility. Then at your first trial, if you go in on a leash and come out on a leash, you've done very well.

I see it over and over with so many teams. They're so anxious to get their dog on the equipment to see "if he can do it" that they skimp on the foundations, which brings me to the mental game. Agility isn't just a romp on the equipment. It's a test of one's relationship with one's dog and of their training Strategizing about particular courses based on skills you and your dog have comes later.

GMK: Border Collies, Golden Retrievers, Shelties, and Papillons are among the most popular breeds for agility. What are the strengths of Manchesters as agility dogs? Have you found yours to be easy to train and motivate?

IP: Exceptionally easy to train! To motivate & to keep his interest, not so much. They're too smart! They're not going to kill themselves for nothing. But that's one good thing other than their basic intelligence, is that at least from what I've seen, they're careful with their bodies. They aren't just speed demons that go crashing through equipment and hurt themselves or scrambling around corners if they're not fit enough for the task. They're also relatively healthy compared to many purebreds. That makes them good agility candidates as well.

Also, my first prerequisite for an agility dog is that it has to live with me as a pet in my home and travel with me. Manchesters certainly have the personality to be good companions and amusing housemates!

GMK: You're very dedicated to the sport. What keeps you going and what lies ahead for you?

IP: I am fortunate enough to be retired and have the ability to travel. My agility dog is my best travel mate! I'm a foodie, but I am not interested in just traveling around to eat. There's never a dull moment trekking around for agility, and I have watched some fabulous teams!

When I describe the sport to my non-agility friends, I compare it to dancing. It's definitely a pairs sport. But I don't know of another one that doesn't have a predesignated program. People think that we have these routines that we practice over and over again like ice skaters and they are amazed to hear that we don't see the course until the day of the competition! And we don't get to practice it. Let alone that there are so many options on how to handle certain sequences.

I guess I'm hooked on the relationship and communication aspect of it. Unlike riding a horse, where speed, collection, extension, lead changes and position are under the rider's control, in agility the dog is working off-leash and participation and willingness to perform are completely voluntary. That's where the magic happens.

About Inez Pennington:

Inez has been running agility for 12 years. She began by taking her backyard rescue Novice A agility dog to 3 MACHs & a PACH as well as qualifying for AKC Nationals 4 years and competing in 3. After retiring from very demanding corporate financial position in 2017, she had more time for dog sports. She graduated cum laude from Vassar college, speaks Italian, and currently lives in Kansas City with her husband (Don) and their three dogs.

Kipsey (MACH3 Mosaic's Whirlaway) is 6 years old, measures 15.75 and competes in the 16-in division. He finished 2022 as the highest scoring agility Manchester (not just MACH dogs), and after finishing both Mach2 and Mach3 in 2023, placed 5th in the 16-in height group at AKC invitationals in Orlando.

In September 2023 our focus turned away from AKC Masters, and more towards UKI and AKC ISC classes. In January 2024 he achieved his international Agility Championship (IAC) from UKI (United Kingdom International). In February at an ISC event near Dallas, the pair snagged a first place in level 3 Agility, and a first and 2 second placements in level 2 classes. They had already qualified for World Team Tryouts before the new year and are planning to attend.



Health Report - Michelle Barlak

After two breeders ran Embark DNA panels on their dogs (one Standard breeder and one Toy breeder) and found a carrier for PRA-PRCD in each case, we are investigating whether this disease may affect our breed. Progressive Rod Cone Degeneration (PRCD) only affects dogs with two copies of the genetic mutation, so a carrier would not be affected. It is NOT known whether a dog with two copies of the mutation for PRCD would be affected in our breed but it's a possibility. It is important to have your breeding dogs' OFA Eye exams done as an ongoing part of your health test program, and not just once before breeding. PRCD can be detected on an eye exam when it is advanced enough.

For now, I am recommending dna testing for this disease until more is known. Should you have carriers, it is nothing to be concerned about, as long as you do not breed two carriers together. Should you have a dog with two copies of the genetic mutation for PRCD, annual eye exams are strongly recommended. Our juniors are the future of our sport. We want to keep them in a safe and nurturing environment.



AN INTERVIEW WITH OLIVIA UYENO submitted by Judi Fleischaker 2023 WESTMINSTER KENNEL CLUB AND AKC NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP FINALIST

What was your first junior showmanship dog?

I started in Junior Showmanship with a 15 inch Beagle named Tracer. Adrienne Paricia mentored me and gave me the dog. I did all the training on him and the grooming.

When did you become involved with Manchester Terriers?

In 2019 I was 12 years old and my Mom took in TAG a male standard Manchester Terrier to do some training. I fell in love with him and he never left our house. I showed him at Westminster Kennel Club that year, (the first year I had qualified for the junior showmanship competition at Westminster), and won the breed! That was one of the most exciting wins for me. Ever since then he has been my Junior Showmanship dog and constant companion.

How many times have you competed in the junior showmanship competition at Westminster? Including this year it will be 6 times. This May will be my last time competing as a junior.

Are there any wins in junior showmanship that stand out in your mind?

Yes, this last year at Westminster when my best friend Ava with her long haired Dachshund, and I with TAG both made it to the finals. It was so incredible that we could both be in that ring together.

Are there any mentors that stand out in your mind?

Yes, Adrienne Patricia was a great mentor on showing my Beagle and teaching me the breed, and all the grooming that was involved in showing him. My sister Breanna was truly my best mentor in junior showmanship.

Do you have any advice to breeders about encouraging children to become involved in our breed? Breeders need to take time to talk to kids and their families at shows. Be willing to talk about our breed. Be patient with juniors, kids do not learn instantly.

What advice do you have for juniors interested in our breed?

Take time to learn the standard and learn about the breed. Work with and spend time with different dogs and work with a breeder. Manchesters are not an easy push button dog like many people think. Each one is different and requires you to work WITH them and encourage them and form a bond with them.

Do you have any advice for the parent club and district clubs?

Yes, make sure you offer junior showmanship at your regional shows and at the National Show and make sure you offer all 3 classes: junior, intermediate, and senior in both novice and open division. It is important to do this because of the rule for qualifying wins for Westminster. There must be at least 2 classes with competition to have the Best Junior Handler win qualify for Westminster.

This May is the last time you will every compete in Junior Showmanship at Westminster Kennel Club, what are your thoughts at this time?

It is hard to compete this year because I already made the finals last year. I look at as one last chance to beat my personal best. I will miss the junior showmanship ring, but as a breeder I am still involved in dog shows and can still hang out and work with the great people in this breed.

American Manchester Terrier Club Code of Ethics

Membership in the American Manchester Terrier Club (AMTC) is a privilege. In return for acceptance into the AMTC, I promise to abide by the following Code of Ethics and to submit to the enforcement of this Code by the AMTC Board of Directors.

GENERAL

I pledge as an owner of Manchester Terriers to be responsible for the dogs in my care. My responsibilities include providing proper shelter which is clean, dry and warm; appropriate veterinary care and inoculations; emergency veterinary care when needed; quality food and water; adherence to local and state animal control and licensing laws.

BREEDING

I pledge:

- 1. To accept and uphold the Standard of the Manchester Terrier as developed by the AMTC and approved by the AKC.
- 2. To breed only physically and mentally sound Manchester Terriers in order to maintain or improve the qualities of the breed as set forth in the Standard. I will not participate in the indiscriminate breeding of studs or bitches with no regard to quality.
- To screen or obtain proof of screening of breeding stock for communicable diseases, hereditary faults or defects, either active or dormant. Questionable animals will not be used in my breeding program.
- 4. To forego breeding unless financially capable and willing to responsibly and caringly maintain whelped puppies until placed in their new homes.
- 5. To maintain complete and accurate breeding records in accordance with AKC regulations.

SELLING

I pledge:

- 1. To in no way misrepresent any Manchester Terrier for sale.
- 2. To provide all buyers with:
- A. AKC individual registration application or certificate properly filled out by seller.
- B. Minimum three-generation pedigree.
- C. Record of inoculations, worming, etc.
- D. Provide instructions for feeding and care.
- E. Be available for guidance and questions.
- 3. Not to sell, give, trade, abandon or in any manner transfer litters or individual Manchester Terriers to pet dealers, pet wholesalers, auctions, laboratories, raffles, pet stores, puppy mills, animal shelters, or any source for resale. I will not knowingly transfer ownership or provide stud service to anyone who intends to breed Manchester Terriers for any of the above listed purposes.
- 4. To take back any Manchester Terrier I bred if the current owner of the dog can no longer keep him or her. I will evaluate the dog as to whether or not s/he is suitable for placing in a new home. In the very unfortunate circumstance that the dog is not suitable, I will either keep the dog myself or provide proper veterinary euthanasia. In the rare event that I cannot take back a dog due to current personal circumstances, I will place the dog in AMTC rescue. I, the breeder, will reimburse any and all reasonable expenses incurred on behalf of a dog in this unusual situation to AMTC rescue.

EXHIBITING

I pledge:

- 1. To serve as an example of good sportsmanship in any aspect of the sport of dogs, assisting and befriending newcomers to the best of my ability.
- 2. To show only those Manchester Terriers which deserve to be champions in light of the Standard and which are in proper condition.
- 3. Not to kennel pack for points in conformation or to engage in any other unfair practices in competition.

PENALTIES

I acknowledge and accept for disciplinary purposes a sliding scale of penalties based upon the seriousness of the deviation from this Code of Ethics. The Board of Directors will apply penalties equally to any and all offenders after a proper review of the evidence. Penalties include but are not limited to: reprimand from the Board; temporary suspension from AMTC membership; permanent suspension from AMTC membership; reporting offenders to the AKC; withholding AMTC awards. I have read and I promise to abide by the above Code of Ethics as set forth by the AMTC.
